Its missions are both: 1) to influence long term US foreign policy for bringing peace and prosperity to the areas involved in armed conflict in Africa; and 2) to create long-term grass roots partnerships and alliances in furtherance of other efforts to help Africa reach its potential regarding respect for life, human rights and the rule of law. Our hope is for a continuing dialogue about what can be done, and how individuals can help, to improve conditions in Africa, and that this day long series of panels will lead to a continuing series of programs on the West Coast of the United States related to our relationship with Africa and its peoples.

Planned presentations include “Can We Prevent Atrocity Crimes Before They Occur”, “How to Lessen the Impact of Armed Conflicts on Civilian Populations” and “How to Heal Societies Following Armed Conflicts.” Panelists will include issues related to the conflict in Darfur, women’s rights, treatment of refugees, and the treatment of women and children during and after armed conflicts.
